No sooner had Peter Bennett finished his Canberra walk than he was back home and packing for a trip to France to compete in the 43<sup>rd</sup> annual Rouen International 24 Hour Walk Classic. This was his fifth outing in this prestigious event which is held in the Espace Jacques Anquetil sporting complex on the Ile Lacroix, a small island on the Seine in Rouen. In 2006, he completed 176.175 km for 4<sup>th</sup> place. In 2008, he returned and won with a huge distance of 214.65 km. In 2009, he won again with 213.885 km. In 2010, he returned to take second place behind Russian ultra walking legend Aleksei Rodionov with a PB distance of 216.240 km.

After recovering from the race, Peter will travel to the north of France and will be cheering on our Australian representative walkers at the World Youth Championships in Lille. Three of the four walkers are from the racewalking club of which he is President.

I haven't been able to find any results online but I did find a one liner in the news archives of the Paris Normandie newspaper which had the heading 'Bennett as expected' and said that he had won with over 200km. I await further news!



#### FRENCH ULTRA FESTIVAL, ANTIBES, FRANCE, 5-11 JUNE 2011

The annual Antibes 6 Day Ultra Distance Festival has been completed for 2011 and once again we saw great times by the walkers. In the men's walk event, victory went to Frenchman Dominique Naumowicz (665.225km) ahead of Spain's Bernardo José Mora (641.773km) and fellow Frenchman Philippe Emoniére (581.198 km). Alain Grassi, the defending champion who won in 2010 with 701.892km, was forced to withdraw from the competition after the second day.

In the women's walk event, Nicoletta Mizera set a new world best with her winning total of 616.025 km. Second place went to Germany's Martina Hausmann with 607.724 km while third place on the podium went to Josiane Pannier who covered 556.575 km. The first three walkers all surpassed the Antibes championship record of 473.972km, set by Pannier last year.

Conditions were made a lot harder when torrential rain early in the race left large puddles along the dirt track. #### SRI CHINMOY 24 HOUR TRACK CHAMPIONSHIP, BRISBANE, QUEENSLAND, 18-19 JUNE 2011

The Sri Chinmoy 24 Hour, 12 Hour and 6 Hour championships were held on the QEII track in Nathan, Brisbane, a couple of weeks ago. The weather on the Saturday was fine with a slight breeze but the clear skies meant the temperatures dropped during the night and early morning and conditions were unusually cold.

There were two walkers taking part in the 24 hour race, Alun Davies (QLD) and Steve Jordan (VIC). **John Harris (C 12)** had entered the 6 hour walk but selflessly gave up his race to help out with the shortage of lap scorers.

Alun, a local ultra runner, looked comfortable as he covered 44km in the first six hours with Steve not far behind on 43km. Both walkers made it to 12 hours still in control with Alun on 86.6km and Steve on 80.8km. The second half was

a trial for both walkers as they battled injury and fatigue. Alun was unable to walk the last few hours due to a severe hamstring injury but both walkers put in credible performances and both look capable of achieving Centurion status in the future.

#### PARIS COLMAR CLASSIC, FRANCE, 22-25 JUNE 2011

And now onto the race report for the toughest annual event on the international walking calendar, the famous **Paris-Colmar Classic**, which was held from June 22-25. It is an annual race of 440 km for men and 300 km for women but not just anyone can enter. Participants are invited to participate based on the results of a series of selection races over 24 and 28 hours. This is the Tour de France of race walking. During four days and three nights, they traverse the French countryside, encouraged on by their crews and by the many supporters who come especially for the occasion. The towns and villages on the race route get right behind the race with banners and cheering crowds as the walkers pass through. The competition starts at Neuilly-sur-Marne in outer Paris on Wednesday evening and finishes on Saturday afternoon in the city of Colmar, near the German border. In fact, it used to be even longer (well over 500km) and the winning time is usually well under 3 days! This year was no exception.

#### Men: 439.3km, Paris to Colmar

This year, the men contested a Prologue and 4 Stages, with very little time to recover between each effort, total distance 439.3km (note the doco says 5km for the Prologue but the times indicate it was more probably 3km).

Wed 22 June, 2:30PM Prologue: Paris (5km)

Wed 22 June, 7PM Stage 1: Neuilly-sur-Marne to Saint-Thibault de Vignes (15km)

Wed 22 June, 10PM Stage 2: La Ferte-soux-Jouarre to Baccarat (356.5km)

Sat 25 June, 9:30AM Stage 3: Corcieux to Colmar (62.8km)

French ultra distance legend David Regy was the first to finish Stage 1 (20km in 1:39:51) and he continued to build his lead in the long second stage. Unfortunately, not far from Baccarat, he was forced to abandon the race and was taken to hospital. This left the way open for Russian ultra specialist and defending champion Dmitriy Osipov to take the overall line honours - 439km in 56:46:11. Such is the toughness of this race that many of the walkers fail to reach the intermediate checkpoints within the designated times and are withdrawn. This year, only 6 of the original 19 starters reached Colmar.

Alvernhe lead the whole way so was a deserving winner. Like with the men, the race took its toll with only 4 of the 10 starters making it all the way to Colmar.

#### PARISH WALK, ISLE OF MAN, UK, 25-26 JUNE 2011

The hugely popular Parish Walk was held last weekend on the Isle of Man. This event offers a variety of distances but the classic challenge covers all 17 parish churches around the Island - the aim is to complete the hilly 85 mile (135 km) route within 24 hours. The walk numbers are astounding - this year saw a record entry of 1756 walkers spread across the various categoies. Sean Hand set the Parish Walk record of 14:47:36 in 2006 and Jock Waddington's winning time of 15:01:48 was not too far outside that amazing time and ranks him as number 2 overall. A total of 159 walkers completed the full 85 miles within the requisite 24 hours. The first lady was Maureen Moffatt with a time of 18:19:21.

"Rank" is position in list of 1,692 finishers (in time order) since 1960; "debut" is the time for a first time entrant; "first" is the time for a first time finisher; "improve" is the improvement compared to a previous best time (blank if slower than best time).


# 24 HOURS HAUTE SAINTONGE, MONTGUYON, FRANCE, 25-26 JUNE 2011
